FIVE- YEAR PROVINCIAL ROAD PLAN

Mayor Rose stated the five-year provincial road plan had been publicized and the following investments had been announced:

2018-19: Hansen Memorial Highway Pulverize, reshape, widen and pave Noels Pond to Brook Street and Install erosion protection near (BSG Long term Care Facility) Route 460. And other work to be completed in 2019-20 for Route 460 and 490.
