Why Stephenville?


The entrepreneurial spirit is alive and well in Stephenville. Our superb quality of life and range of business support programs create a great environment to foster new business ideas.

With several major projects in the planning stages, including World Energy GH2's wind-powered green hydrogen Project "Nujio'qonik" and projects related to bio aviation fuel production and mass timber construction, The Town of Stephenville is poised to become a Global hub for green energy and sustainable industry.

Connected



Road

Katarina Roxon Way (Route 490) connects Stephenville to the Trans-Canada Highway. An excellent transportation thoroughfare in Newfoundland, the Trans-Canada Highway's fast-moving traffic makes for exceptional highway travel. It provides quick access to central Newfoundland, the Avalon Peninsula, and mainland Canada via the Port Au Basque ferry terminal, allowing Stephenville-based companies to move goods across Eastern Canada and beyond efficiently.

Sea

Port of Stephenville operates year-round and is a sheltered, fully equipped and staffed ice-free deepsea port. With a depth at the dockside of 10.1m, it can accommodate ships up to 385m in length and has a turning basin of 450m turning radius. The 100,000 sq ft Port of Stephenville Warehouse Building is newly refurbished and has three 30-ton overhead cranes. as well as a range of forklifts and other machinery to cater for all possibilities.





Air

Air connections are currently made via nearby Deer Lake Airport. However, Stephenville Dymond International Airport (former Stephenville Airport) is opening with plans to become a World-class aviation and technological hub for Eastern Canada.

Responsible



A Sustainable Community

Stephenville will ensure its long-term sustainability through careful maintenance and upgrading existing infrastructure, developing green building policies, promoting renewable energy projects, and various conservation, education and outreach initiatives.

Having recognised the impact of economic and social changes and trends, Stephenville will work with neighbouring communities to establish principles, objectives and strategies to guide sustainable and economic land use and development in the region for the long term.

Expanding Housing Opportunities

Housing stats demonstrate the popularity of our community, with a 10% increase in the number of single-family homes over the last ten years. This represents an investment of around \$75 million in new single-home construction in the Town.

Additionally, the Town plans to implement programs to create municipal and co-op housing developments to increase the available housing stock and provide additional protection for persons needing housing assistance.

Investing in Parks, Recreation and Culture

Parks, recreation and culture play a critical role in the quality of life of our residents; as such, we plan to ensure that the Town's programs, facilities and services, heritage opportunities and available amenities continue to meet the growing needs of our residents. This includes expanding and improving existing infrastructure and creating new facilities, programs and opportunities for recreation.

A Growing Post-secondary Presence

The town is home to The College of the North Atlantic (CNA), one of the largest colleges in Atlantic Canada, offering almost 100 full-time and 300 part-time courses across 17 campuses in Newfoundland and Labrador.

Stephenville also hosts two campuses of Keyin college, one of Canada's largest private colleges, offering a range of post-secondary and adult introductory education courses.

In addition to the two colleges, Stephenville is the location of The Marine Institute's Safety and Emergency Response Training (SERT) Centre, one of Canada's premiere fire training facilities.

Regional Collaboration

The Town of Stephenville is the largest of several communities in the Bay St George area. It is the local service centre for the southwestern part of Newfoundland, serving a direct population of 35,000 people from surrounding areas and over 100,000 people along the entire southwestern coast. Stephenville actively seeks partnerships and collaborates broadly with local communities and indigenous groups. These efforts are essential to our current business retention and knowledge economy and our ability to support future population and economic growth.





Community Revitalisation



Occupational data showcases that, with more than 3,000 workers in the town and many more in neighbouring Bay St George communities, Stephenville's labour force covers many occupations. With such a variety of creative and skilled workers, our community is well-positioned to help staff grow and lead your business for years to come. Additionally, our resident post-secondary educational institutions have multiple vocational programs to provide high-quality graduates to ensure that Stephenville can continue providing the right people for the job as the community grows.

Unique Cultural and Recreational Assets

The Town of Stephenville is home to a strong base of cultural assets, including the Stephenville Theatre Festival, the province's longest-running professional theatre company. Throughout the year, the community hosts events such as The Sweetgrass Festival and The Friendly Invasion Festival, as well as various social events held by organisations such as The People of the Dawn Friendship Centre and the Lions Club. These events provide opportunities for residents and visitors to experience aspects of the local culture and quality of life associated with living in Stephenville.

In addition, several cultural creative businesses contribute to the local economy, making it a more vibrant and livable community filled with visual and performing art programs. The Town also maintains numerous parks, playing fields and recreational facilities. In particular, The Dome hockey arena, a four-sheet curling club, a YMCA, and the Regional Aquatic Centre, provides a full range of water safety training and leisure swimming activities.

Room to Grow

Stephenville and the surrounding area are poised for extensive growth, not just in terms of population but also in the range of industries and size of the future projects which have been proposed.

To increase our capacity, The Town of Stephenville is embarking upon a program of cadastral surveying, infrastructure upgrading and additional housing development so that we continue to meet the needs of our residents and businesses by offering an increased range of commercial and residential space opportunities.
