Congratulated Brenda Dennis for her award of citizen of the year.

Mayor Rose

Congratulated World Energy and Horizon Maritime in acquiring the Port of Stephenville. This will play a critical role in the development of the green hydrogen project for our region. It's anticipated this investment will bring future major investment as the ports will need infrastructure upgrades. This is on the heels of Carl Dymond and NL Partnerships transferring Public Meeting of Council June 1st, 2023

funds to purchase the airport. He acknowledged that residents have supported the airport to stay operational over the past 30 years and with World Energy, Dymond and investments coming the airport is in a good position.

He stated the College of the North Atlantic hosted a successful event for the Canadian Association of Motor Power Educators (CAMPE). There were high level educators from across the county present, and the town's economic development officer, Mike Ratter played a critical role in marketing Stephenville and the important developments happening. He acknowledged he spoke at the Centre for Heavy Equipment and Transportation Technology, it's the college's flagship facility in Stephenville.

Councillor Aylward

She acknowledged and thanked Dr. McComiskey for his services as he resigned from the position as chief of staff.

Western Health is renovating the housing units in Stephenville, which will help attract medical professionals.

She acknowledged the restrictions for foreign doctors are being reviewed, which may help with recruitment.

Deputy Mayor Fowlow

Acknowledged that government has set a precedence in allowing both Grand Falls and Gander hospitals to maintain obstetrics services; and in comparison, Stephenville and Corner Brook are no different. Deputy Mayor suggested it's time to engage government and health officials to improve the services offered at the Stephenville hospital.

Extended support to Deputy Mayor, Nicole Kieley and her family as she recovers from a serious accident.
