Mayor Rose

He clarified a statement he made during a recent interview. The intention of my statement that was made during an interview in reference to the community grant program was to clarify that the council and the town of Stephenville should continuously improve our communication with our community; It was not the intention to suggest that staff did not communicate as directed. He noted the council do have the greatest respect for our employees and the work that they do. He noted the town will be accepting applications again for the community grant program soon and an announcement will be forthcoming.

NEW BUSINESS

Deputy Mayor Fowlow

Stephenville Day

She thanked the recreation and wellness department for the successful Stephenville Day event that was held on Main Street for the first time. She also acknowledged the RCMP participated, and their fundraising event raised \$2006 that was distributed equally to Mothers Against Drunk Driving - MADD and Sick Childrens Foundation.

Run the Rock Event

Councillor Boland, Fire Chief and herself participated in the Run the Rock fundraiser event.

She congratulated Darrell Chipp placement at the national disc golf tournament, noting he was instrumental in setting up disc golf in Stephenville.

Fireworks

She reminded citizens of the towns firework policy that allows fireworks on New Years Eve and July 1. We will continue to communicate as people have indicated they were unaware of the policy. She suggested communication also be sent to the retail stores that sell fireworks.

Councillor Boland

She congratulated Katrina Roxon. Deputy Mayor noted for a community our size and the limited seasonal training facilities, athletics are still winning on the North America and World stages. Mayor Rose commented that World Energy commitment of 3.3 million dollars over three years may be used to provide recreational indoor space.

Mayor Rose

August 5, 2023, the first ship was docked at the Port of Stephenville under the new owners World Energy/Horizon Maritime. The Polar Prince docked with young environmental scientists/university students, mentors, and coaches. The program is called the Blue Economy; which is supporting and protecting ecosystems around the water. He noted he attended the presentation for the group along with Councillor Aylward and Councillor White.

He noted he met visitors from Boston that flew in on a private aircraft. They later communicated and praised the town's air quality and the exceptional hospitality. They will be purchasing a property in the Stephenville area. The mayor stated we have so much to offer, we are the best on the West Coast.

August 23, 2023, will be the one-year anniversary date of the of the signing of the Green Energy accord between Germany and Canada in Stephenville. He stated this was the largest political signing in the history of the province of Newfoundland and Labrador. This

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is G7 level and since the signing World Energy has purchased the Port of Stephenville. He stated this is a signature project estimated at 12 billion dollars and scaled as the single largest private investment in the history of Atlantic Canada. The process is proceeding through crown lands and environmental approvals. He stated this will be a game changer for Newfoundland and Labrador. And we will be reaching out to provincial leaders to talk about potential growth and infrastructure requirements needed for the town.

In 2024 we will be exploring increasing lighting in our community for safety.

Councillor Aylward

She stated she had a call from resident on New Mexico Drive, concerning child safety with the constant vehicles speeding. In response Mayor Rose suggested this be brought forward to be addressed and explore speed bumps.

Update on Sir Thomas Roddick Hospital

She met with senior officials for western zone. Chief Administrative Officer is now Terra Freake, Chief of Medical Affairs is now Dr. Scott McKenzie, Jim Wiseman, Facilities and also liaison for the STRH foundation. Two new doctors will be starting at the Bay St. George Medical Clinic. The registration process for emergency department is under a new pilot project. They will be issuing a Request for Proposals to accommodate staffing until a new clinic is built. Mayor Rose made comment, once world energy project is approved, we will need to meet with provincial health care officials to ensure the hospital has adequate staffing for future requirements of the town.
