NEW BUSINESS

Councillor White

Councillor White, advised she attended a meeting at the College of the North Atlantic where they introduced a new partnership with SpacesShared. It's an online platform that helps pair seniors with empty rooms in their homes with students.

Mayor Rose

Mayor Rose noted the Federal Government has announced a program for homeowners to receive a subsidy to renovate basement apartments to alleviate homelessness and housing shortages.

He acknowledged staff of the fire department were present in the chambers; he welcomed the fire chief and one of the captains. Stating the fire department is composed of both career firefighters and auxiliary firefighters. He noted the town recently purchased a suburban vehicle for the department, the purchase was allocated in the budget, and it will be used to support rapid response to emergencies. The equipment will also used as a response vehicle for substation in bottom brook, the MOU with Emera provided funding to support the department's ability to respond.

He acknowledged the Town of Stephenville airport was left out of the RFP for Heart Force One; and this is a problem. This service provides air travel to and from the Health Science centre for same day procedures. He noted we will communicate with the elected representatives to demand the RFP be changed to include Stephenville, and he suggested there should be consequences to whomever made this error of omitting. The residents of Stephenville and our surrounding communities deserve this service just like everyone else.

Councillor Aylward

She clarified that the Stephenville Hospital Foundation Board is different than the Hospital Health Board. She acknowledged the Foundation is doing well, and she has volunteered almost 31 years with the board, with 30 years as chairperson.
