

Town Supports Expansion of Indian Head Hatchery

The Town of Stephenville is voicing strong support for the proposed expansion of the Indian Head Hatchery, an important aquaculture facility within the municipality.

In a letter to the Honourable Scott Reid, Minister of Environment and Climate Change, the Town highlighted the economic, environmental, and community benefits of the project.

The expansion includes major infrastructure upgrades to boost production and improve operations. Planned improvements include enhanced freshwater and saltwater systems, new effluent treatment facilities, and modern environmental controls.
