

2025 Spring Clean-up



PLEASE NOTE:

CURBSIDE BULK COLLECTION WILL BE DONE THE WEEK OF OCTOBER 6 - 10 AND ON THE SAME DAY AS YOUR REGULAR GARBAGE COLLECTION. THIS IS ONE DAY ONLY PER STREET. NO ADDITIONAL PICKUPS WILL BE MADE.

What's accepted for bulk collection:

- *Household appliances (refrigerators, stoves, hot water tanks, etc.)
- *Household furniture (sofa, chairs, & mattresses, etc.)
- * Broken glass (safely packaged)
- * Lawn Furniture
- * Toys (bikes, etc.)
- *Garden items (branches, leaves and grass cuttings)

What's not accepted for bulk collection:

- *Hazardous, explosive or toxic waste
- *Liquid wastes
- *Construction waste (i.e. gyproc, shingles, lumber, windows, doors, concrete, etc.)
- *Paint products (i.e. household paint products & containers, paint aerosols automotive, & industrial paint)
- *Electronic Waste (E-Waste) (i.e. display devices such as TVs and monitors, desktop printers and scanners, computers and peripherals, home theatre in a box (HTB) systems.
- *Tires
- * Automotive parts

Sorting

Due to safety concerns and time constraints, it is important that refuse is placed into three (3) separate piles for curbside pickup.:

Pile 1:

- *Household Appliances, etc.
- *Furniture, mattresses, toys
- *Appropriate clear or blue bag

Pile 2:

- * Metals

Pile 3:

- *Tree branches
(Tied & Bundled)

Things to Remember

- * Appliances and/or metals should be kept separate from other items to allow for separate pickup by the garbage contractor.
- * Environmental guidelines require that prior to disposal, all fuel storage tanks must be emptied, vented and purged using steam or some other acceptable method.
- * Separate garbage from recycling. Household garbage must be put in clear bags while recyclables can all be combined in blue transparent bags.
- * Small Items must be contained
- * Refuse not properly sorted will not be collected.
